



## Call for Committee Applications

### CLFN Lands and Resource Management: Advisory Committee Appointment

Cold Lake First Nations is seeking applications from Nation Members who are interested in serving on a voluntary basis on a Reserve Lands Plan Advisory Committee for a period of approximately one year.

A Reserve Lands Plan is key for setting out Cold Lake First Nations' vision for land and resources, and for reflecting the priorities and values of our Nation. The intent of the Reserve Lands Plan project is to create a plan for CLFN's reserve lands and traditional territory that will guide the Nation's priorities for sustainability, future development, resource use, and traditional site management and protection.

Committee Members will serve as a community sounding board throughout the Reserve Lands Planning process and provide staff and consultants working on the project with input on issues and opportunities related to land use and future growth on reserve. Members will provide advice and support related to a community engagement strategy for the project and help ensure broad and diverse input from community members, living on and off-reserve. This will help in developing the Reserve Lands Plan goals and actions and aid in decision-making.

Applicants must satisfy the following criteria in order to be eligible to hold a position on the Committee:

1. Must be a member of Cold Lake First Nation and at least 20 years of age.
2. Must be committed to acting in the best interest of the all CLFN members.
3. Must be committed to regular attendance at all Committee meetings.
4. Must support the mission, vision, values and goals of Cold Lake First Nations.
5. Must respect the confidentiality of information shared or overheard during the process.
6. The Advisory Committee will ideally consist of a combination of members from each of the reserve locations, Elders, youth and members with experience and knowledge.

To apply, please submit resume and statement describing why you want to serve as a member of the Reserve Lands Plan Advisory Committee.
